



Dear Parent/Guardian,

In order to ensure that all students achieve the best possible outcomes in the GCSE History exams next summer it is essential that revision begins as early as possible. This will also give them the opportunity to discover individual strengths or weaknesses and help focus revision.

The History Department have prepared revision guides for students to complete ahead of the exams next summer. The students have to learn about four separate modules for the two exams:

- Germany 1890-1945 (studied in Year 9)
- Conflict and Tension 1918-1939 (Year 10)
- Health and the People – Medieval to Present Day (Year 10)
- Norman England (currently being studied)

The first revision guide that the History Department has produced is for the Germany module. Each student has received a copy of the revision booklet, and has also been sent an electronic copy via Doodle.

As a Department, we are expecting students to complete this Germany revision booklet by the week commencing 4th November. The tasks are linked to the exam specification and will ensure the best possible preparation for the summer exams, as well as the winter Mock exams.

Your child's revision booklet will be checked on a regular basis – if he/she has any questions or concerns these can be discussed with any member of the History team. A new revision guide for a separate topic will be issued in due course. We would be grateful if you support your child with revision as well as giving regular reminders to complete the assigned tasks by utilising the timetable below.
