

01 <u>Background</u>

In 2021, a group of friends from 6 different university Chemistry Departments created a test for Year 10 students to try. It was the middle of the pandemic and learning had been horribly disrupted. They wanted to encourage students and give them something positive and enjoyable to try at a difficult time. Now, after more than 20,000 people had a go, teachers and students stated how much they enjoyed it, the university student group have decided to keep running it every year.

This week Eton College debaters returned to Cox Green School for another session of debating. Before considering a motion, all debaters discussed the nature of the British financial system, looking at the Reserve Bank and its

primary goal of keeping inflation low, along with its secondary goal of reducing poverty. This was discussed in the context of commercial banks' relationships to the Reserve Bank and to business and personal borrowers, and investors. There was also discussion of the IMF and the similarities it can be seen to have to a Reserve Bank. The motion that was then prepared was "Central Banks should protect the environment as well as lower inflation and prevent poverty." This led to a good discussion

about how the market economy can be utilised to address

climate change and whether this is the best method of doing so. An alternative motion was also considered which was "The Central Bank should be controlled by the

political party in power." which led to a discussion of the importance of stability and impartiality in the financial system. A very good session for all.
