

British Biology Olympiad

The British Biology Olympiad is designed for students in post-16 education. It challenges and stimulates students with an interest in biology to expand and extend their talents. The competition consists of two, 45-minute multiple choice papers. Students were presented with topics and ideas which they are not familiar with and the competition aimed to improve their problem solving skills and understanding of core principles. In addition to encouraging and rewarding pupils in their studies, the BBO is the first stage in selecting a team to represent the UK at the International Biology Olympiad (IBO).

Eton College Debates

This week the motion before the house was "This house regrets the rise of social media as a primary source of news distribution." Quite some time was spent with the group as a whole developing the various advantages and disadvantages of social media as a news source. This included the democratisation of news so that more people could have a voice and also more people being able to access news, but debaters also considered the very real difficulties of fake news, click bait and other associated problems that have arisen with social media news. That included the greater polarisation of views in societies due to lack of balance and the trend towards focusing on news stories that only reinforced pre-existing ideas.

After a lively debate in parliamentary style (with two government teams and two opposition teams) the motion was affirmed so that the rise of social media as a primary source of news distribution was seen as a regrettable development in society.

National Scientific Thinking Challenge 2024

In 2021, a group of friends from 6 different university Chemistry Departments created a test for Year 10 students to try. It was the middle of the pandemic and learning had been horribly disrupted. They wanted to encourage students and give them something positive and enjoyable to try at a difficult time. Now, after more than 20,000 people had a go, teachers and students stated how much they enjoyed it, the university student group have decided to keep running it every year.

Cambridge University Trip Wednesday 7th February 2024

On Wednesday 7th February a group of Year 12 students were lucky enough to be invited for a tour of Selwyn College at the University of Cambridge. They were given a very warm welcome by the Schools Liaison Officer Stuart Wren who started the visit with a brief presentation on what to expect from student life at Cambridge. Cox Green students really appreciated the opportunity to ask questions and talk to students who are currently studying at Cambridge so they could gain a deeper understanding of how Cambridge is different from other universities. The students were then given a tour of the college buildings seeing halls of residences, libraries and other recreational and study areas. After eating lunch in the dining hall (had many similarities with the Great Hall in Hogwarts!) the students were then taken into Cambridge for a very lively tour of some of Cambridge's world famous icons such as the Mathematical Bridge, the building where the structure of DNA was determined and the many meeting places where these ideas were discussed. After a stop at a locally renowned bakery (to honour Mr. Hagazali's baked goods order!) the students returned to the college for one last photo opportunity.

We are hoping we will be able to arrange a similar trip next year, and that representatives from the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge will be able to come to Cox Green School to talk to the senior students about future opportunities.
