The students will also be taking part in a Future Pathways event in school on Monday 24th May, where the application process will be launched formally with them.

# End of year mock examinations.

As you are aware all students are completing a 2-year study programme making the mock examination period vitally important. Over a two-week period, every student will undertake exams across all of their subjects, enabling teachers to truly grasp the progress being made. It is important that students prepare well because these mock examinations will be used for future target setting and will be the main body of graded work used for predicted grades on university and apprenticeship applications. These will run from 14<sup>th</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> June and students should be actively preparing themselves for these now. The content of the assessments will reflect the disruption to learning that has happened this year, to ensure no students will be disadvantaged due to Covid.

## Work Placement update - Monday 12th July - Friday 16th July

During this week students will be undertaking a week of work experience that they source themselves. These can be 'in person', or remote placements that many companies are offering. Once each student has organised their placement, they should see Mrs Hannah Thompson for the paperwork they are required to submit, which is an essential part of the process. If you know that your child is finding it difficult to source a placement, and you are not able to help, please contact us so we can ensure they have the support to secure these placements. Students unable to secure a work placement will be required to attend school and support with alternative curriculum week. We are always happy to hear from employers who would be able to offer opportunities to our students, and if you are aware of any please do let us know.
