Dear Parents/carers

Thank you for your continued support this week, I really am so proud of the cohesion and care shown throughout our school community.

As you will know following the Prime Minister's announcement on 12 October, RBWM is now a medium risk category and cases are continuing to rise across the Borough, schools unfortunately are not immune. The school is required to communicate with parents/carers if there is a confirmed case, which is done diligently and in line with Public Health England's direction. Understandably this can be unsettling for parents but please be assured that we have to adhere to the strict guidelines regarding the sharing of information and we can only share what we are permitted to by Public Health.

Cox Green School has been commended by Public Health England and RBWM who have visited the school, for the excellent safety measures it has put in place to help limit the spread of this virus in the school and Borough. The school, like all other schools continues to review its measures regularly and all students and staff will now be required to wear a mask in between any lesson changeovers and in communal areas.
