Dear Parent/Guardian

YOUR CHILD'S HPV VACCINATION (Human Papillomavirus) IS NOW DUE

All young people aged 12-13 in the UK are now eligible for the HPV vaccine. In order to be fully protected against the strains of HPV young people need two doses which are given 6 to 12 months apart to ensure full protection is given.

The HPV vaccine protects against the human papillomavirus which is linked to 90% of cervical cancers and 5% of all cancers worldwide. The vaccine gives protection against the most high-risk strains of the human papillomavirus including ones which can cause:

- Cervical Cancer
- Some mouth and throat (head and neck) cancers
- Some cancers of the anal and genital area

We are due to immunise at your child's school (**Cox Green School**) on **05 April 2022**. The code is **BK137695**

Please submit your form **by 9am 48 working hours before your session date** to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form, please telephone 0300 365 0077 and the team will be happy to help.

Please note that as in previous years you must opt-in to the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child will not be vaccinated.
