## **Awarding GCSE grades Summer 2021**

The process of making grade judgements will follow the guidance provided by Ofqual in February.

- Assess students' performance, only on what content has been delivered to them by their teachers, to determine the grade each student should receive.
- Use evidence of a student's performance from throughout the course to inform the grading judgement.
- Determine the grades as late in the academic year as is practicable to enable teaching to continue for as long as possible.
- Use a broad range of evidence across the taught content to determine the grades to determine the grades before submitting the grades to the exam boards.

#### **Explanation of the evidence**

Each of the subject Learning Leaders has decided which type of evidence they will be using when making a grade judgement. This is outlined in the tables under each subject heading below with additional information included to provide further context.

An explanation for what each source of evidence comprises is explained below.

**Internal assessments April/May 2021** –These assessments will take place across a four-week period in lessons (see assessment schedule spreadsheet)

**December 2020 Mock exams** – Reflects the performance in the mock exams that were conducted in December 2020. These exams were conducted in highly controlled conditions and in most cases used actual past papers.

Non examined assessments (NEA)/Coursework – This is only relevant to those subjects that have an NEA component as part of the course. A NEA is the coursework element of a subject and is included to assess knowledge and skills that can't be tested in an examination. Students will not be penalised if they have not completed their NEA by the submission date if it is a result of circumstances that are beyond their control.

**Current grading from previous assessment reports** – This represents the current grades that have been published on assessment reports over the course of study. These grades were based on a significant piece or pieces of work produced at various points of the course.

**Other controlled assessments** – These are assessments that have been conducted in lessons at various stages of the course and have reflected exam style questions or tasks that have been marked according to exam standards.
