Reading Room Support + Behaviour/Outreach	60,062	£ +5	Effective use of intervention for early identification and intervention. Also used for post exclusion reflection and restorative work to reduce number of repeat offences.
Alternative Curriculum	3,330	£££ +4	SATRO construction bus has worked effectively and all pupils have passed the course.
Social Worker + Student & Family Educational Workers	54,212	£££ +3	Effective spend in terms of keeping students on track and reducing PA figures. A number of anxious students were able to attend and complete the school assessments because of the support they received.
Attendance	22,053	£££ +2	Effective for some students but others with severe medical and family issues meant it did not have the desired effect.
Careers Guidance	8,380	££+1	Effective. All students have destinations and there are no NEETs. All disadvantaged students tracked into year 12/13 have achieved their desired outcomes.
Education Welfare Officer Support	3,990	£££ +3	Not as effective as severe medical and family issues affected attendance.
Education Psychologist/EMTAS	3,998	£££ +4	Effective where it resulted in the securing of an EHCP. All the time allotted to us was used and school is better able to meet needs once these needs are understood with help of EP.
School Counsellor	3,293	£££ +4	Inconclusive. The effectiveness of this is hard to ascertain, as the very nature of the work is private and tracking of the outcomes is difficult.
Guidance to support transition - Y6 into Y7	2,385	£+2	A new Head of Year 7 was appointed and very effective. A number of activities were carried out in a range of primary schools, which increased Y6 student's familiarity of Cox Green School. All students were met, as were all parents and additional transition days for SEN students prepared them well for the start of the year.
Financial Support for Trips/Transport/Food Tech/Stationery	705	£££+3	Very few extra-curricular activities have taken place this year and this funding has been used to support pupils with activities such as 1:1 music lessons and purchasing tools for learning. That has enabled pupils to come to school in the current uniform, for example
