
The Sixth Form curriculum at Cox Green is one that allows and supports opportunities for all: to apply for university; to secure apprenticeships; to progress

<u>Study Ready – Post-16 Academia</u>


On GCSE results day, it is the priority of the Sixth Form team to ensure you are on the appropriate courses linked to your future goals and academic performance. At Cox Green School you can select an A Level, BTEC or 'blended' pathway which equates to 3 A Levels.

Students have assigned 'study periods' for each subject which are built into their timetable. These study periods are planned by our dedicated A Level teachers who provide a framework for academic excellence. Alongside

this, the Sixth Form team utilises opportunities to check your progress, support and guide you through transition to A Level study.

Studying at Post-16 provides greater independence, broadens your skill set and prepares you for undergraduate study. Moreover, the vast curriculum on offer provides you an opportunity to build the qualifications that best suit you, even providing the chance to tackle the prestigious EPQ. We encourage our staff to prepare you for the study required at university or in an apprenticeship environment, and to challenge you on a day to day basis.

Meanwhile, our professional coaching in the Sports Academy, as well as our incredible extra-curricular offer, teaches the value of being a well rounded individual to support your academic study.



Life Ready - Beyond the Classroom

Our pastoral programme:

- **Support:** Our committed Sixth Form team will provide you with support every step of the way on your journey. The close knit group will provide regular, caring and personal support to every individual student in the Sixth Form. This is a key feature of the Cox Green Sixth Form as students forge strong relationships with their mentors and advisers.
- Personal Development/Tutor program: Tutors follow a stringent tutor and personal development programme which
 is adapted for the needs of the young adults we care for. Utilising powerful and engaging external speakers,
 alongside the expertise in school, Cox Green Sixth Form provides an awareness of the important traits needed for life
 beyond academia.

 Enrichment: All students take part in Enrichment activities once a week. These timetabled sessions are truly unique. Opportunities provided are invaluable with a growing list of schools, charities and businesses grasping the opportunity to work with our young people. Enrichment provides an opportunity to work with others, work with the local community or build external qualifications. This contributes to the students being able to present a more well rounded individual ready for adult life.

- Ambassador and Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) programmes: You are encouraged to provide mentoring or extra-curricular activities to achieve a Bronze, Silver or Gold 'Sixth Form Ambassador' award. Success on the DofE programme has lead to many alumni achieving a gold award and a visit to Buckingham Palace!
- Junior Student Leadership (JSL): Sixth Form students lead the JSL programme which meets regularly to drive change for the better within the school.
- **Careers:** A dedicated Careers Advisor and regular links with external providers ensure that you are guided towards appropriate destinations whether it be university, the work place or apprenticeships.

Careers Support

Cox Green Sixth Form has always prioritised funding and planning for our Sixth Form students. They have privileged access to our full time, on-site Career's Advisor, the benefit of career's apps such as Unifrog, and well-established links with local, national and multi-national companies based in the vibrant Thames Valley area. Every Sixth Form student completes at least one work experience placement while studying with us, as well as benefitting from a variety of volunteer awards and advice from businesses and other external providers. It is for this reason the school is a leading Career's Hub School within the county.

The **intent** of the Cox Green Careers' Programme is to provide students with the following:

- Current and relevant market place information for academic, vocational courses as well as employment and the world of work;
- Advice and guidance to inspire students to realise their ambitions;
- Timely and tailored information so that students can make decisions about their next steps;
- Support for parents and staff, enabling students to take their next step;
- Access to a range of information and experience within a wide network.

Cox Green implements this by having:

- Our in-school Careers Advisor, Hannah Thompson who supports with university and apprenticeship applications, writing CV's and interview skills;
- One to one careers meetings for every student;
- A careers presence at school events;
- Opportunity for parents to engage with the Careers Advisor by making appointments at parents evenings;
- The Careers Advisor has an open-door policy;
- An extensive collection of university and college prospectuses available;
- Various events during the year including Careers Insight, Careers Fair and a range of speakers;
- Academic subjects which promote careers within their subject areas as appropriate;
- Use of a wide range of resources including LMI Information, Unifrog (supporting UCAS and vocational and employment post-16/post-18 steps);
- The Gatsby Benchmarks (framework to ensure the best career provision for our students);
- The opportunity for all Year 12 students to connect to LinkedIn to aid their futures and build a network of support for each other and the school in the future.





We also welcome external applications from students who have completed their examinations elsewhere.

Our final course offer is, as usual, subject to final student numbers.

Our policy is to ensure that students accepted into the Sixth Form are placed onto appropriate courses that will ensure that they achieve their very best.

For this reason, the entry criteria on the following pages apply to the courses offered.

Please note:

- Cox Green Sixth Form is open to offering three-year pathways which can be discussed with individual applicants.
- External applications must be accompanied with a reference.


