






## Year 10



## Berkshire County Schools Athletics Championships

We are delighted to report on the success of our students at the Berkshire County Schools Athletics Championships which took place this week.

Despite not having tried the event for two years, we are extremely proud of Kaamil-Zain Davis who won the District event. His achievements continued on Saturday, where he became the Berkshire Schools' Triple Jump Champion with a jump of 11.97 metres! This event draws the very best athletes from the Berkshire schools and we are absolutely thrilled to include a photo of Kaamil-Zain with his medal and certificate. Congratulations and a huge well done!

We would like to congratulate Toby Smith who won a silver medal in the tough 1500 metres steeplechase event as part of the Intermediate Boys section. In the Junior Boys age group, Jesse Thompson jumped an excellent 1.60 metres in the high jump. Although nobody jumped higher than Jesse, four athletes finished with the same height, and on count-back Jesse won the bronze medal for third place. Well done!

Special mention to both Yasmin Grant (Senior Girls 1500m) and Lucas Cannon-Jones (Junior Boys 200m) who narrowly missed out on medals, finishing a very respectable 4<sup>th</sup> place in their races.

We are very proud that 13 of our students qualified for this event which attracts some of the very best athletes in Berkshire.

The PE Department would like to congratulate all students who qualified for the event, representing Cox Green and RBWM.
