
#### Cox Green vs Garth Hill School East Berkshire League Championship Final Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2025

### RBWM League Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2025



We were very proud of our athletes for their exceptional performance at the RBWM League which took place on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> May.

Pride of place goes to Kaamil-Zain Davis competing in the Triple Jump, and we are delighted to announce that he will be joining the District team following 3 brilliant jumps. He won the event by jumping almost 1 metre further than any of his competitors, and his 3 jumps were the 3 longest on the day, the best measuring 12.17 metres!

Josh Hall stormed to victory in his heat of the 100m in a time of 12.03 seconds, just 0.03 seconds behind the quickest time of the day. Ashton Monello was fastest overall in the 200m, recording 25.23 seconds with Anton Belnavis 2<sup>nd</sup> in his heat.

Continuing the sprinting successes, Neive Norcott won her 200m heat in 29.91 seconds and was second fastest on the day. Our relay teams – girls and boys – both won their heats, with the boys the quickest team of all and the girls fourth fastest. In the boys 300m, Jude Perry took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in his race, and Freddie Birch took 3<sup>rd</sup>. Well done to Maya Barley was 2<sup>nd</sup> in her 300m race.

In the girls Long Jump, a leap of 4.28 metres by Keevah Delaney was just 2 cms short of the winner's jump, meaning she finished an excellent 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

With numerous other solid performances by Cox Green students in various field and distance events, it was a really good team performance. We are hopeful that the Year 7 and Year 8 Boys team will also qualify for the finals, with their next event being held on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> June.

We are delighted to announce that Cox Green school has qualified for the RBWM League Finals and our athletes look forward to taking part with the other top 4 schools on Monday 16th June 2025.
