Looking for Potential Rowers in and around Marlow

Marlow Rowing Club are looking to find young athletes who have what it takes to potentially make it into the GB Rowing Team, racing at the World Championships and Olympic Games.

There will be a free event on Saturday 3rd and Sunday 4th June

Come down to the club and experience the sport first hand. It will involve assessments to measure physical attributes and strength, as well as a short taster session on the water.

Height brings a big advantage in rowing, so ideally girls should be at least 176cm (5'9") and boys at least 188cm (6'2") tall.

No prior rowing experience is necessary.

They are looking for athletes who may currently be playing a different sport, such as rugby, netball, volleyball, basketball or swimming, but who have the right build and physicality to succeed at rowing.

(If you are interested but cannot make one of these days, please get in touch to arrange an alternative.)

British Rowing also has a Paralympic team. Some disabilities to qualify for this are obvious, such as those that fill the 'arms-only' and 'trunk-and-arms-only' categories, but there is a third 'whole body' category for which disabilities can easily be overlooked, such as visual impairment, nerve damage or fused bones.
