68 Year 9 Explorers conquer the local area

Divided into 10 determined groups, they set off from school with Longridge in their sights, tackling their self-planned routes with a mix of anticipation and grit.

Navigating through winding trails and testing terrain, each group demonstrated impressive teamwork and resilience. Upon reaching the campsite, the adventure continued as tents were pitched, meals were cooked over camp stoves, and campcraft skills were put to the test.

After a night under canvas and breakfast, the journey continued with even more navigational challenges on the return leg. Tired but triumphant, all 10 groups made it to the finish line — a fantastic accomplishment.

A huge congratulations to all participants for successfully completing the expedition section of their Bronze Award. We can't wait to see many of the students take their next step with the Silver Award in Year 10.

On Tuesday, 17 of our students from Years 7, 8 and 9 took part in Jamie Oliver's 2025 Pasta Champions, which was entered an an official Guinness World Record attempt!



The students followed along live with Jamie Oliver and participants from over 700 schools, to make a pasta dish with a no-cook tomato sauce. Thank you to Mrs Williams and Mrs Leroy for organising the event, and also our parent volunteers from the PTFA who attended.


WHAT WE DID THIS WEEK
