

Assemblies this week: Be Kind: Anti-Bullying



This week, the students participated in a series of activities for Anti-Bullying Week, which is a national campaign supported by many secondary schools to bring an end to bullying.

On Monday, the students were given a creative puzzle piece challenge. The students were asked to decorate the jigsaw pieces which will then be joined together to unite in a whole school anti-bullying pledge on Friday. The students enjoyed wearing odd socks on Tuesday to recognise and celebrate individuality.

Years 7, 8 and 9 were invited to a series of presentations by guest speakers including representatives from Kooth, RBWM, Cox Green SAFE team and mentors. The students took part in activities that showed the harmful impact of bullying and the importance of demonstrating kindness and empathy to others. Throughout the programme, the students were reminded of the staff that they can speak to for pastoral support. Club of the Week Debating Club (All years welcome)

The Cox Green students are frequently joined by representatives from Eton College for the debates. This week, the focus for the session was upskilling the students in the three aspects of debating; the mechanism (analysis), the impact and the rebuttal (challenge). The debaters rotated between three rooms to consider each point of the structure of debating. In the analysis room, two motions (proposals for discussion) were considered; 'The ethics relating to the trade of organs for money' and 'The rise of social influencers'. In the second room, the debaters then had to consider the impact of these motions. In the final room, the students focused on rebuttal (challenges) and show why some arguments are more powerful than others.



Supporting your child to return to school after the holidays



Going back to school after the holidays for children who struggle to attend might be daunting. Here are some top tips for parents of children who struggle to attend and are worried about the return to school:

Listen to your child's worries and let them think of solutions. How do they think they can deal with this? Reassure your child that feeling anxious is normal.

Inform the school of any concerns - If there are problems, find out the best point of contact at your child's school (SAFE Manager, Head of Year or Form Tutor) and keep them updated. Consider making a list of the ways you think the school could best support your child to return to school. Be open with the school and seek support.

Build a calming night time routine. Limiting time on social media and electronics can help improve sleep and reduce anxiety.

Consider doing practise runs of the school commute, check bus timetables and discuss lunch arrangements. It might be an idea to prepare something to look forward to after the first week or two back. This could be their favourite meal or a movie night, or simply a treat at the end of the day.

Encourage your child to get everything ready the night before to help prepare for the school day and reduce anxiety. This will help make it less of an ordeal when it is time to get everything ready in the morning.
