This Monday, Cox Green students travelled to Eton College for an "away" debating fixture. Our visit began with a walk to the founders statue of Henry VI who began the College in 1440. There, we could also admire the Tudor architecture of the quadrangle built in the time of Henry VIII. We had lunch with our Eton College hosts, before walking to the debating chamber. Preparation then ensued for the motion *"This house would make voting mandatory."* A full British Parliamentary style debate was prepared, and unfolded with arguments ranging from proposition's contention, that voting was such a hard won, and right now amounted to a duty to do so. Opposition, however, discussed, amongst other things, the impracticality of getting all people who were eligible to vote actually doing so (given the current working conditions that so many people have). There was discussion about lack of research by voters, so that many would "spoil" their vote with a blank vote or be unnecessarily influenced by social media in the way they voted.

Ultimately after a debate, that the adjudicators agreed was of a very high standard, opening opposition were awarded the debate, and it was concluded that voting should not be mandatory! It was excellent to see the progress Cox Green students have made in their debating, and they are keen to continue improving with the sessions that follow!



On Tuesday, Year 10 History students visited Norden Farm for a Holocaust Memorial Event. Holocaust Memorial Day marks the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau and to observe this day, our Year 10 History students attended a screening of the film 'Nicky's Family' at Norden Farm. The event

included a special discussion and Q&A with Nick Winton, son of Sir Nicholas 'Nicky' Winton and also hosted various workshops. Former Maidenhead resident, Sir Nicholas Winton was responsible for saving the lives of 669 children, by organising their evacuation by train to foster families in Britain. Today, the story of this rescue is known all over the world and dozens of Winton's 'children' have been found. To this day, his family has grown to almost 6,000 people. 'Nicky's Family' is a docu-drama which tells the story of Nicholas Winton and the Czech Kindertransport. His exploits would have probably been forgotten, if his wife hadn't found a suitcase in the attic full of documents and transport plans, some fifty years later. Thank you to the staff at Norden Farm for hosting our students.


