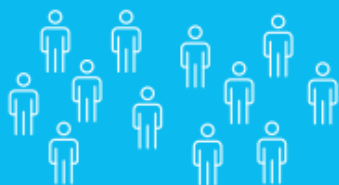

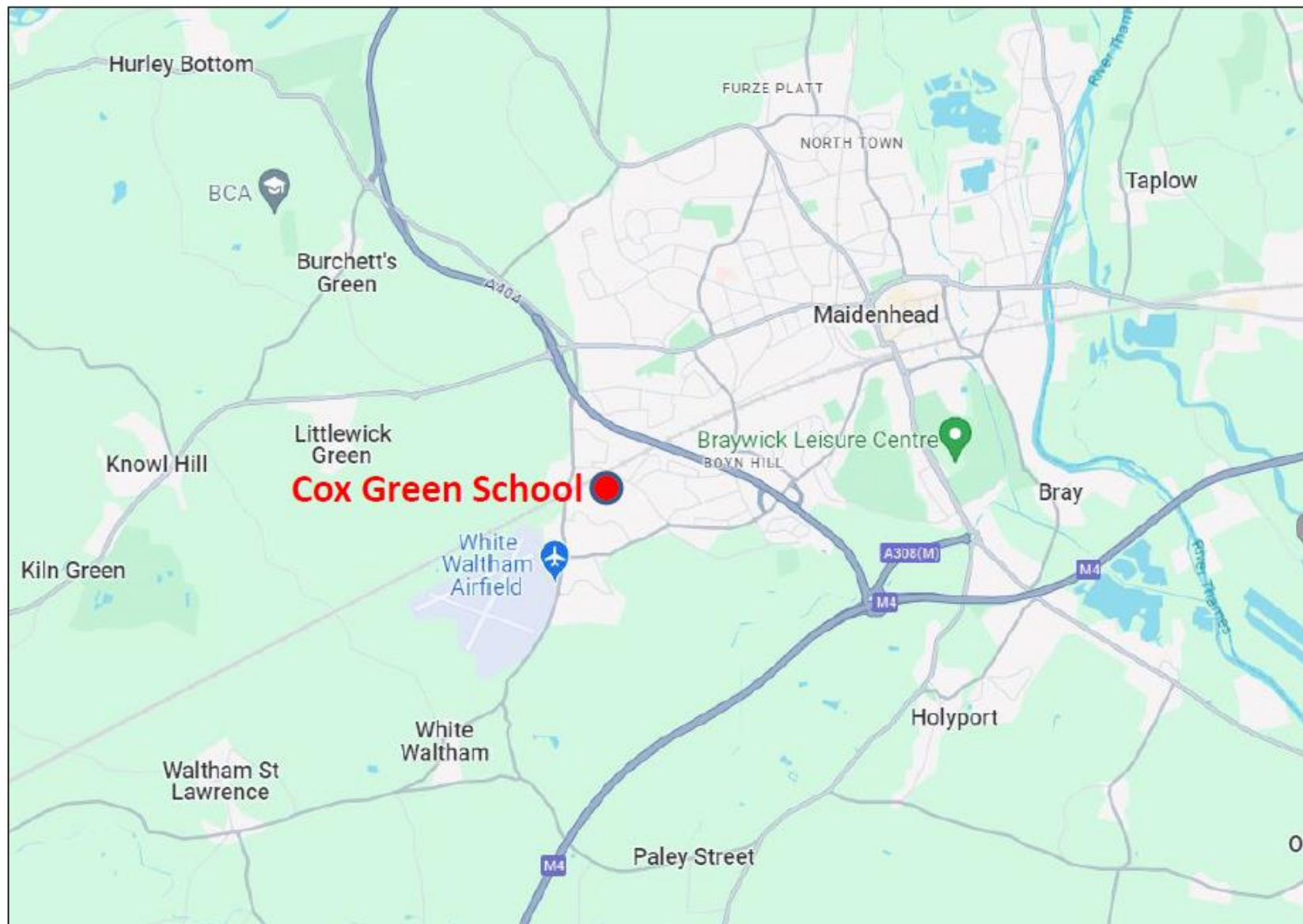

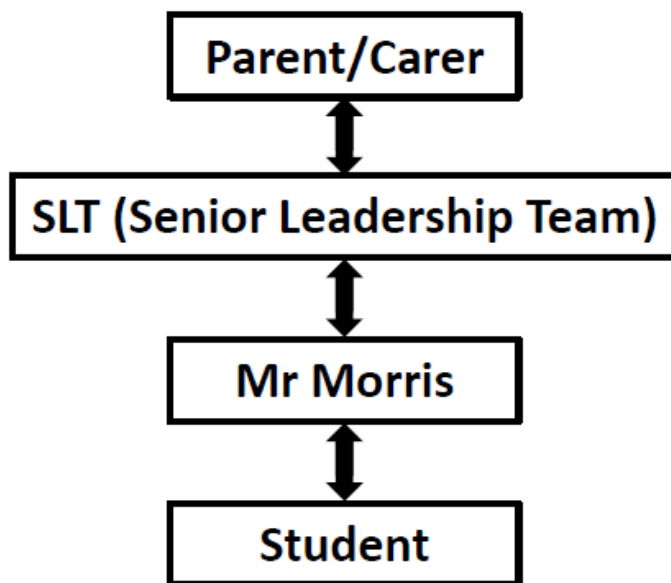
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Emergency Contact

Medicines and OA4 Form (in your envelopes)
