Health Advice

STREP A / SCARLET FEVER

You may be aware of the recent media coverage surrounding an increase in case amongst children of Strep A, which in a few cases has sadly been fatal due to bloodstream infection. Although this is a common bacteria, in its mildest form causing a sore throat, it can lead to Scarlet Fever, which is highly infectious and parents should be alert to recognising signs and symptoms to avoid its spread.

Awareness of these isolated cases of a more serious nature, naturally cause concern amongst parents/ carers and we would like to pass on the information below which has been offered to schools on the prevention of its spread in the school community.



ADVICE FOR PARENTS FROM NHS FRIMLEY

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to you because we know parents and carers are worried about the national outbreaks of Scarlet Fever, caused by a Group A streptococcus, a bacterial infection.
