DWP Household Support Fund

Royal Borough of Windsor & Midaphod

The DWP Household Support Fund aims to help households in need to deal with the rising costs of living. If you are facing financial difficulties and are at risk of problems escalating, you may be able to receive a $\pounds 145$ cash payment, to help you this winter.

Residents can apply for this support through speaking to one of nine organisations across the borough, who are partnering with the council.
