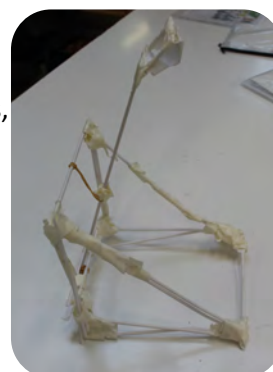

This activity links directly to the curriculum and the students will be specifically tasked to use this for research and inspiration towards their final exam work.
