Computer Science Trip to Bletchley Park





Year 10 and 11 Computer Science students visited the National Museum of Computing, based in Bletchley Park. They had a really great day learning about the history of computing and the part that it played in World War 2. In particular they looked at the Enigma and Lorenzo devices that were used by the Germans to encrypt all their communications. They learned how this was done and the principles behind the encryption ultimately putting all their hard earned knowledge to the test both encrypting data and decrypting ciphertexts.

They also went on a journey following the development of computers here in the UK and the world, which culminated in them being able to interact with the earliest forms of computer based entertainment from the 70's through to the 00's.
