Using their own UK location photographs, the students deconstructed reality into geometric forms; discovering how simplified shapes can create powerful visual impact.



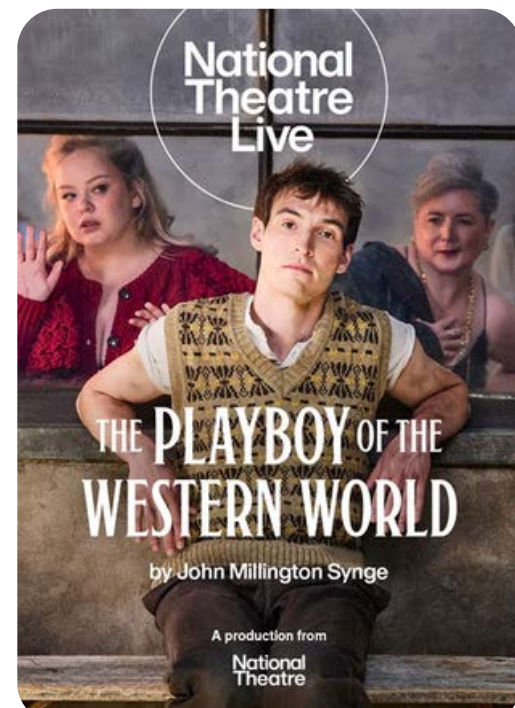
## SIXTH FORM NEWS

On Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June, the Year 12 Performing Arts BTEC class watched the National Theatre live recorded production of the "Playboy of the Western World" at the Oden Cinema. The performance included an all star cast with Nicola Coughlan (Derry Girls, Bridgerton), Éanna Hardwicke (Normal People) and Siobhán McSweeney (Derry Girls). This was a National Theatre adaptation of this classic Irish play.

The pre-recording of the live production invited a further discussion for the students, as they considered the impact of filming the performance for the audience. The recording allowed for the production to include a close up of the actors' physical and vocal skills, and the students felt this direction also provided an insight into the National Theatre impressive sets.
